At first Lea thought she and her brother were the worst burned people alive until James Bosch invited them to a burn camp. This burn camp inspired her and changed her perspective on living with burns. Lea is currently serving as the President of the Board of Directors of the Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation in California.

Lea graduated with her Bachelor's in Biology, Anatomy and Physiology from the California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo and then eventually went back to school to obtain her Bachelor's in Nursing from Samuel Merritt University. Lea works as a Registered Nurse in a Burn Unit and an Emergency Department in San Jose, California.
